Friends' Stewardship Team ensures safe, clean, and accessible trail corridors through routine maintenance, remedial repairs, and enrichment training. By deploying volunteer groups, partnering with municipalities, collaborating with peers, and engaging communities around skill building, we protect and enhance the Three Rivers Heritage and Water Trail systems.

SEASON STATS



We kicked off more waterbased trail care this year

- >> 1,654 volunteers contributed 4,930 hours
- >> (90,359) lbs. of litter removed
- >> 75 volunteer events held
- >> 485 new trees planted
- >> 905 trees cared for

TRAIL CARE

Friends hosts trail care opportunities focused on managing litter and vegetation, maintaining assets, installing amenities and restoring viewsheds.

Out of all trail care participants this year:

- 54% volunteered for the first time
- 55% volunteered more than once in 2024
- (!) over half of our volunteers came back again!

Our **Train on the Trail series** offers enrichment opportunities for the public to gain knowledge benefiting volunteerism and trail experience.

RESTORATION



As a member of the Pittsburgh Canopy Alliance, Friends will leverage \$350K in Inflation Reduction Act funding to conserve tree canopy, suppress invasive species, and plant 500 trees in designated Justice40 Communities.

- utilized licensed herbicide applications

COMMITMENT

Volunteer Trail Stewards adopt a trail segment or water trail launch to ensure trail systems are monitored, cleaned, and cared for. Stewards receive training opportunities such as CPR/First Aid training and Paddlesports safety to prepare them in their roles.

IN 2024, OUR 26 VOLUNTEER TRAIL STEWARDS:

- actively monitored 11 trail segments and 7 water trail launches
- premoved 460 trash bags totaling 9,200 lbs
- **®** committed 935 hours
- submitted 410 Activity Reports and 113 maintenance notifications

trail experience

Trail Experience oversees the Trail Ambassador Program, gathers public input, and plans events to create more accessible and enjoyable trail experiences.

TRAIL AMBASSADORS

Trail Ambassadors are volunteers who monitor trail conditions and helps trail users feel safe. They also offer information, maps, and more.

2024 NUMBERS:

- O 577 volunteer hours over the 7-month season
- O 18 active Trail Ambassadors
- 1420 interactions with Trail users
- 37 reports made to *311, 30 closed/completed
- 253 reports on trail conditions sharing stories/photos, and logging interactions

This project focuses on extending the Three Rivers Heritage Trail through Hazelwood to the existing Duck Hollow segment and extends to the Carrie Furnace site.


